Living Learning Communities: both residential and curricular, allowing students to take one to three common first-year courses together with the ability to build supportive social and academic networks in and outside of the classroom. 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COMMUTER LIFE

Student Centers have lounges and microwaves.

Busch and Douglass Centers: designated commuter lounges to relax in and meet other students, while enjoying amenities including a refrigerator (Busch) and kitchen (Douglass).

Commuter lockers: College Ave Student Center,
Douglass Student Center, and Livingston Student
Center. Students are able to store items for a few hours
or for the entire day based on their schedules and
needs. Lockers are free of charge and come in various
sizes for ease and convenience.

Rutgers Commuter Student Association: The Rutgers Commuter Student Association (RCSA) is an inclusive volunteer student organization whose primary role is to serve commuter students' needs and interests while building a community on campus. NAVIGATING CAMPUS

On Campus Parking

How to get a parking permit: Visit <u>go.rutgers.edu</u> parking and log in to your parking portal account with your NetID and password.

Where can you park: You may only park in lots designated for students:

ipo.rutgers.edu/parking/permits/students

Please make sure that your plate is facing the driving aisle at all times. If your state does not have a front plate, then you cannot back into a parking stall.

Is it a physical pass: Rutgers uses license plate recognition (LPR). You will not receive a hang tag or sticker.

Rutgers Bus System

Do you have to pay to ride a Rutgers bus: No, You do not have to pay a fire to ride the bus!

Do you need to show an ID to ride a Rutgers bus: You are not required to show an ID during normal operating hours which are Monday-Thursday, 6am- 3:30am and Friday-Sunday, 24 hours a day
